Alcohol Regulations GLOBUS festival

Preamble

Considering that:

- GLOBUS festival based on Article 9 of the Licensing and Catering Act for the festival must have alcohol regulations;
- The temporary bar during the festival with an exemption in accordance with Article 35 of the liquor and catering license is considered by law as a catering facility, which means that alcoholic beverages are served on site on a commercial basis or for a fee;
- The Alcohol Regulations contain rules of the GLOBUS festival, which aim to ensure responsible distribution of alcoholic beverages during the festival
- The GLOBUS board has decided to draw up these Alcohol Regulations GLOBUS festival, from now on referred to as 'regulations'. This has been checked on 29th of June 2021 by Sjeff Molling from Wageningen University and Research.

Section 1 General provisions Article 1 Definitions

1. GLOBUS

GLOBUS is a festival organized by a group of students in collaboration with Wageningen University and Research. These Regulations apply to all activities organized by the GLOBUS board in the context of GLOBUS Festival.

2. GLOBUS-board

The persons in charge of organizing GLOBUS festival.

4. Festival site

The location determined by the GLOBUS board where the program components take place. This includes the manifestation site on the Wageningen Campus.

5. Alcoholic Beverages

Low alcoholic beverages: beer, wine and spirits with less than 15% alcohol or mixed with them.
Spirits: Distilled with 15% alcohol or more or mixed with this.

6. Bar Volunteer

A volunteer who, at times when alcohol is served, performs the bar work in the bar under direct supervision of the bar coordinator. Qualification standards for bar volunteers are laid down in Article 7 of these Regulations.

7. Managers/bar coordinators

Persons appointed and instructed by the GLOBUS board in charge of the bar. They are at least 18 years old and can directly manage the catering activities in the bar. Qualification standards for bar coordinators are laid down in Article 7 of these Regulations.

8. Social Hygiene

Social Hygiene means that people treat each other healthily, that they take into account each other's values, norms and roles. During GLOBUS festival it is mainly about knowledge and insight into the influence of alcohol use (and abuse) and how to promote responsible alcohol consumption in the bar. House rules and rules of conduct and social skills to propagate and comply with these rules are important here. Social Hygiene also includes knowledge of the Licensing and Catering Act and related regulations and the Advertising Code for Alcoholic Beverages, of various business formulas and target groups and of technical, architectural and spatial facilities of the establishment.

Article 2 Legal provisions

From the point of view of responsible alcohol dispensing, the following legal provisions must be observed:

1. The sale of alcoholic beverages to persons under the age of 18 is prohibited.
2. The sale of spirits is not permitted in the context of the exemption from Article 35 of the Licensing and Catering Act.
3. Age limits and serving times must be displayed visibly in the bar.
4. The supplier of alcohol must determine the age of the prospective buyer, this can be seen by whether or not he has an 18+ wristband.
5. It is prohibited to provide alcoholic beverages if it is suspected that these Alcohol Regulations GLOBUS festival lead to disturbances of public order, safety or morality.
6. It is not permitted to supply alcoholic beverages to persons who are in an apparent state of intoxication.
7. It is prohibited to admit persons in the bar who are apparently intoxicated or apparently under the influence of other psychotropic substances.

Section 2 Social Hygiene Provisions

Article 3 Presence of manager

At times when alcoholic beverages are served from the bar, a manager is always present.

Article 4 House rules and rules of conduct

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1. It is not allowed to use alcoholic beverages you have brought with you on the GLOBUS festival site on the Wageningen Campus. This is checked when entering the festival site.

2. It is not allowed to consume alcoholic beverages bought in the bar elsewhere than on the GLOBUS festival site.
3. From the point of view of the aim of alcohol moderation, the use of non-alcoholic drinks is promoted, among other things by offering them cheaper or at most the same price as alcoholic drinks.
4. Persons who display aggression or other deviant behavior will be removed from the GLOBUS site by the duty manager, bar volunteer or other GLOBUS volunteer.
5. No alcoholic beverages are served to persons who are in an apparent state of intoxication. This assessment is up to the bar volunteer and, if in doubt, to the bar coordinator.
6. Managers and bar volunteers (within the meaning of the provisions of Article 1) do not drink alcohol before or during their bar shift.
7. No alcohol is served to CREWers or members of the press in the course of their duties.
8. Price promotions that encourage the use of alcohol such as 'happy hours', 'meters of beer' and 'rounds of the shop' are not allowed.
9. The GLOBUS board wants to prevent people with more than the permitted alcohol level from taking part in motorized traffic. On that basis, the supply of alcoholic beverages can be refused.

Article 5 Checking age

1. Alcoholic drinks can be ordered during the event. Visitors under the age of 25 are asked to provide legal identification to verify age before serving alcoholic beverages. This prevents visitors under the age of 18 from consuming alcohol.
2. In the absence of a way to determine the age of a person, the supply of alcohol to that person is not permitted.

Article 6 Opening hours and serving times

The opening hours/serving times of the bar are in accordance with the exemptions in Article 35 of the liquor and catering license as applied for by the GLOBUS board. Alcohol Regulations GLOBUS festival as part of the event license. The licensed exemption is leading in this regard.

Article 7 Qualification standards and instructions for responsible alcohol use for bar volunteers and bar coordinators

Qualification standards have been established for the bar volunteers.
bar volunteers:

- are at least 18 years old
- have followed an instruction responsible alcohol use which is registered with the GLOBUS board and are registered as CREWer with GLOBUS.

An online instruction for responsible alcohol serving can be obtained from bar volunteers via ww.nocnsf.nl/IVA. In addition, an expert or bar coordinator can also give instructions to bar volunteers. An (electronic) copy of the IVA certificates must be present at the GLOBUS board, a registration list of the bar volunteers who have followed the instruction must be in the possession of the bar coordinator.

The additional requirement for bar coordinators is that they are at least 21 years old. Bar coordinators must be extensively informed about their duties in advance by the GLOBUS board.

Article 8 Information

1. Pouring times, age limits (Article 2, paragraphs 1, 2 and 3) and house rules and rules of conduct are displayed in a clearly visible manner on the site.

2. Where relevant, the GLOBUS board pays attention to advertising campaigns in the context of responsible alcohol consumption.

3. The GLOBUS board endorses the existing regulations regarding advertising for alcoholic beverages.

Article 9 Enforcement, complaints procedure and sanctions

1. By virtue of its responsibility for compliance with the laws and regulations, the GLOBUS board will make use of the sanctioning powers under these Regulations in the event of violation of the rules of these Regulations.

2. A non-exhaustive list of sanctions for violation is:

1. the removal of the GLOBUS festival site,
2. removing the festival site by removing the wristband.

3. Substantiated complaints about the application of Articles 1 to 7 of these Regulations must be brought to the attention of the GLOBUS board without delay.

4. The GLOBUS board verifies the complaint, hears the complainant if necessary and, if the complaint is found to be justified, takes measures within two months to prevent recurrence. The GLOBUS board will inform the complainant of the outcome of the assessment.

Anyone can submit well-founded complaints about the violation(s) of the Licensing and Catering Act to the municipality.

Article 10 Final provision

1. These Regulations enter into force on 3 and 4 July 2021

2. The GLOBUS board can change these Regulations if the circumstances give cause to do so.

3. In cases not provided for in these Regulations, the GLOBUS Board will decide.

4. These Regulations are published on the GLOBUS website and a copy is available in the bar on the GLOBUS festival site.
